

Screening Process

- Anyone entering a long-term care home that is fully vaccinated (at least two doses) will be required to complete Rapid Antigen Testing (RAT), two times per week.
- Anyone that is not fully vaccinated or unable to confirm vaccination with a QR code (for Ontario residents) will be required to complete a daily RAT.
- Anyone with a previous confirmed positive PCR test will be exempt from surveillance testing for 90 days.

All essential visitors entering any City of Toronto LTC home will use the new online health screening process.

To access the screening tool, go to toronto.ca/ltc and select the **Screening Process**. You can use your smartphone or for those without a device, there will be an iPad available for use at the LTC home's entrance screening area.

- Select **Entry or Exit Screening Form**
- Select **Visitor**, then **Continue**

Enter the following information:

- **First and Last Name**
- **Room number of the resident you are visiting**

Using the drop down lists, select:

- **Location** (Name of long-term care home)
- **Visitor Type** (Essential Visitor/Caregiver, Contractor, Physician, Volunteer, Student, etc.)

If you received a **PASS**:

- Please show your smartphone or screenshot to the screener upon arrival to the entrance/exit
- If you do not have your confirmation, the screener will retrieve your results.
- You will have your temperature taken to determine permission to enter/exit.

If you received a **FAIL**:

- Please do not visit the home.
- You are advised to contact a primary care provider, local public health unit or Telehealth to discuss your symptoms and/or exposure and seek testing.

If you receive a **PASS**, but your temperature check returns a reading above 37.8°C:

- You will not be permitted to enter the home.
- You should not make contact with the screener or any other staff members or visitors and are to return to your personal residence to self-isolate immediately.
- You are advised to contact a primary care provider, local public health unit or Telehealth to discuss your symptoms and/or exposure and seek testing.
